Action Item: Bylaw Changes

Bev Reber reviewed the following changes to the bylaws:

4. Governance, ss d. Membership of Governing Board

i. Any Regular Member who is a current or retired teacher, or other employee of an educational entity in the state of Massachusetts, or a full-time student, age 18 or over, shall be eligible for nomination and election to the MassCUE Board of Directors.

ii. Educational entities, for the purpose of these Bylaws, shall include public, private, and charter schools, educational collaboratives, colleges and universities.

Rationale: One sentence has been split into two.

4. Governance, ss d. Membership of Governing Board

- i. Any Regular Member who meets the following requirements shall be eligible for nomination and election to the MassCUE Board of Directors.
- 1. has been a member consecutively for at least one full year, and
- 2. who has actively contributed to MassCUE consecutively for at least one year, and
- 3. who is a current or retired teacher, or other employee of an educational entity in the state of Massachusetts, or a full-time student, age 18 or over.

Rationale: Renumbering makes the language more readable.

- 1. Aligns the Bylaws with the Procedures.
- 2. New language will help us understand the candidate's commitment to MassCUE.

4. Governance, ss d. Membership of Governing Board

ix.Liaisons to other organizations and Advisors to the Board may be appointed to consult and collaborate with the Board and make recommendations but not vote.

- 1. Liaisons from other organizations and groups will act as conduits to share similar interests and goals, and help facilitate collaborative planning of mutually beneficial events.
- 2. Advisors will provide specific expertise valuable in governing the organization and assisting in reaching the goals defined in the strategic plan.
- 3. Liaisons and Advisors to the Board will serve for two and a half years, and will be appointed or reappointed at the same time as the appointed members of the Board.

Rationale: Aligns all appointments to the same time period

4. Governance, ss e. Election

v.Certifying nominations will be done by the Elections Committee, in accordance with the Board approved Election Committee Procedures.

viii. Nobody running can be involved in tabulation during the election period, from opening nominations to reporting results.

Rationale:

v.Clarifies the language.

viii. Tabulation is done electronically, so we don't need that word.
