Board Governance

MassCUE has been working with Community Matters to study how our Board governance operates and guide us in longer-range strategic planning.

Conferences

Fall Conference: MassCUE is known for our 2-day conference at Gillette Stadium in October. Our keynote speaker was Dr. Ruha Benjamin, Professor at Princeton University. Our second day we promoted our Ted-talk style keynote with 3 speakers: Steve Dembo, Mary Skipper, and student Sachi Badola. Both days we had featured speakers Marty Geoghegan, Brian McCann, Andy Plemmons, and Kerry Gallagher. There were over 2500 participants that attended 200 sessions during the 2-day conference.

Spring Conference: The focus for our spring conference was leadership. We partnered with MASCD to host the event "Lead Like a Pirate" at Holy Cross with over 190 participants. The keynote speakers were Beth Houf and the Administrative Leadership Team from Natick Public Schools. Participants attended 31 sessions with 52 presenters.

Datapalooza: Was held on 1/24/18 with 80 attendees with keynote Dr. Damian Bebell. We offered 17 sessions including topics such as Data Dashboards for Effective Communications, Building a System of Regular Data Use: Tools for School and Department Leaders, and Targeting Literacy Using Data for School Wide Informed Instruction.
