Working with like-minded organizations is one of our Strategic Plan Goals. This year we collaborated with M.A.S.S, MASCD, LearnLaunch, MSLA, WGBH, and NYSCATE. Since remote/hybrid learning began in March 2020, MassCUE had continued to provide a variety of additional supports for educators including Virtual Learning Tours and collaborating with CSforAll to offer Digital Learning and Computer Science free workshops supported by a DESE grant.

Committee Highlights

Awards & Recognition:

Due to move to a virtual conference both the Administrator and Pathfinder Award were put on hold.

Outreach & Engagement:

The Committee provided virtual support for MassCUE members and Massachusetts educators through various online platforms maintaining its' commitment to nurturing the values MassCUE represents. While face to face meetings were no longer viable, committee members continued to dedicate their time to supporting online events and trainings through MassCUE including added involvement in the online Virtual Conference. Planning continues for when personal contact is again possible to broaden the reach of MassCUE in the state.

MassCUE Champions Program

The Champions program continued to work to support Massachusetts educators remotely throughout the duration of the year. Champions offered virtual support and training sessions independently and through MassCUE offerings such as Googlepalooza and the annual conference which was held virtually for the first time. This year specifically, the Champions exhibited the traits that make them true ambassadors of MassCUE.

Communications:

Focus this year was given to projects and products that best served our educators in a remote and hybrid environment. We continued to foster social media engagement through OnCue podcasts, Twitter chats, and a new installment called Tech Tip Tuesday. The committee continues to analyze social media and website data each meeting to best direct our efforts. Targeted posting schedules and mindfulness of the board's Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) work were also at the forefront of our efforts.

Grants & Scholarships

The Grants Committee put a hold on classroom grants due to the COVID-19 pandemic. However for the Feb. 2021 Virtual Conference MassCUE in collaboration with its vendors provided 74 teacher scholarships to the conference.
