We have incorporated equity as a theme in our Spring Leadership Conference and received some incredible proposals for presentations! We are excited to share the schedule with you soon. We are in the process of getting a quote for those services and hope to announce our progress next month. currently in her sophomore year at Bucknell University) to analyze member feedback from our fall survey. Those results should be available soon!

We know that equity requires action, and as such have planned a year's worth of action steps to ensure we are progressing in our campaign. Our February action steps are as follows:

- 2. Get a quote for our equity audit to start planning for funding
- 3. Create action steps from the results of our fall survey results
